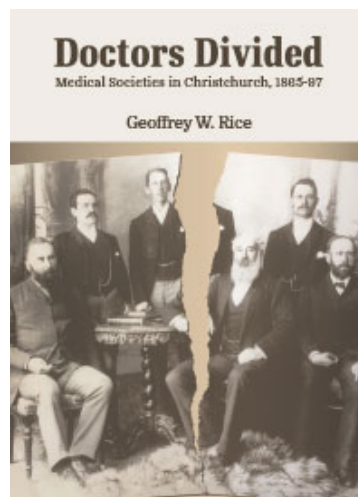

Meet some colourful and quarrelsome doctors. Christchurch medical men in the late nineteenth century included some strong personalities, often divided by personal as well as professional differences. Yet they were all interested in treating disease and the latest surgical techniques in a period of transition from the traditional medicine of miasmas and blood-letting to the modern era of bacteriology and aseptic surgery. This book has a richly varied account of what interested New Zealand doctors in the late nineteenth century, from advertising and smallpox vaccination to cures for constipation and TB, the use of electricity and antiseptics, and the 1891-3 influenza pandemic.
